### **IT IS THE RIDER'S OBLIGATION TO KEEP CURRENT ON ALL RULE CHANGES.**

#### **HORSE INSPECTIONS AND EXAMINATIONS: PASSPORT CONTROLS**

Horses entered in CDI 3\* classes are required to be stabled in the FEI Stabling compounds. FEI passports or National passports are required for horses and must be presented at the inspection. Stabling Fee \$165 Horses must be on the grounds no later than 12:00 noon and will be presented for in-stall inspection at 12 pm Monday. Horses stabled elsewhere on the show grounds for the season are required to move to the FEI Stabling compound. Ride times for classes held on Tuesday will be drawn upon the completion of the inspection. **Jog will begin at 4PM on the Monday** prior to the first day of scheduled competition and in entry number order.

**Kentucky Health Regulations:** All horses entering Kentucky must be accompanied by an official health certificate issued by your state of residence, signed by a licensed veterinarian who has examined your horse within the last 30 days, and stating the horse is free from symptoms of any infectious diseases or exposure thereto.

**Expenses:** The Organizing Committee is not responsible for any expenses of competitors, horses, owners, their employees or agents, and does not offer expense allowances or reimbursements.

**Tack Check:** A steward will check the saddlery of EACH horse immediately after it leaves the competition arena. Any discrepancy will entail immediate elimination (Art. 428.5). The rider or groom is to open the cavesson of the bridle and open the horse's mouth for the steward to check the bit.

**Kentucky Horse Park Rules:**

**Admission**

- a. All exhibitors are required to pay a one-time \$5.00 parking fee upon arrival on park grounds. Exhibitors will receive an exhibitor parking pass that will allow them entry to the main parking lot for the remainder of that event.
- b. Exhibitors wishing to tour the Kentucky Horse Park may purchase reduced Park admission tickets at the Kentucky Horse Park Visitor Information Center.

**Electrical Appliances**

In compliance with the State of Kentucky Fire Code, the Kentucky Horse Park does NOT allow any of the following in stalls, barns or tents:

- a. any 2-prong plug appliances
- b. any 2-prong plug extension cords
- c. light duty cords for indoor use
- d. any 3-way adaptors unless specifically made for outdoors
- e. any adaptors without 3-prong connections

**Parking/Traffic**

- a. NO PARKING is permitted in the stabling areas, arenas, on the grass or in other designated NO PARKING areas. This will be enforced. Violators will be ticketed and towed.
- b. Exhibitors should park their empty trailers and horse vans in the marked areas in the main Kentucky Horse Park parking lot. Loading and unloading of vehicles in the stabling/show area is permitted.
- c. No trailer parking with electric or water hook-up is permitted in any of the barn or arena areas. Trailers and RVs requiring this service should make reservations with the Kentucky Horse Park Campground.
- d. Horses and carriages have the right of way on all roads and paths.
- e. The speed limit on all roads is 25 m.p.h. The speed limit in the barn areas and campground is 10 m.p.h. This is enforced by the Kentucky Horse Park Police.
- f. Hall of Champions Road is closed to all event traffic, including golf carts, mopeds, and bicycles. No event traffic should enter the main visitor area of the park.
- g. All drivers of any vehicles on the Park must be at least 16 years-of-age and have a valid driver's license. This includes golf carts, scooters, mopeds, etc.
- h. The Kentucky Horse Park reserves the right to revoke golf cart privileges from any exhibitor for violations or abuse.

**Camping**

- a. The Kentucky Horse Park Campground accepts reservations. Exhibitors should call Reserve America at 1-888-4KY-PARK (888-459-7275) or make reservations online at [www.parks.ky.gov](http://www.parks.ky.gov). Exhibitors wishing to make group reservations should contact the Kentucky Horse Park Campground at 859-259-4257.
- b. Exhibitors also have the option of staying in the Kentucky Horse Park Tent City. This is a small campground located near the covered arena on the show grounds. Availability is on a first-come, first-serve basis. Upon arrival, exhibitors will need to check-in and make payments at the Kentucky Horse Park Campground. Occasionally Tent City is not available due to conflicting events.
- c. No camping is allowed in the stabling area, around the show rings, covered arena, or any other non-designated area.
- d. Showers are available on grounds in the rest rooms.

**Bedding**

- a. Wood shavings and straw are considered acceptable forms of bedding.
- b. Bedding can be pre-ordered through Dever Show Services at 859-233-9702. Exhibitors should contact Dever Show Services at least 24 hours prior to their arrival to make arrangements.
- c. Exhibitors may also bring their own bedding with them.

## **Kentucky Horse Park Rules Continued:**

### **Muck**

- a. The Kentucky Horse Park will clean all stalls prior to said event arrival and upon departure.
- b. All muck generated during event must be placed in marked muck bins. Muck should NOT be placed in the barns, at the ends of the barns, or in any other non-designated area. This is punishable by a fine.

### **Feed**

- a. Feed and hay can be pre-ordered through Dever Show Services at 859-233-9702. Exhibitors should contact Dever Show Services at least 24 hours prior to their arrival.
- b. Exhibitors may also bring their own feed and hay.
- c. A tack shop is available on grounds for purchase of basic supplies.

### **Horse Requirements**

- a. All horses entering Kentucky Horse Park grounds must have valid proof of negative coggins test (within 12 months). A 30 day certificate of veterinary inspection is required for all horses arriving from outside the state of Kentucky.
- b. The Kentucky Horse Park requires all horses/ponies/mules be treated in a humane manner in accordance with various state and local humane society guidelines. Show management is expected to enforce fair and human treatment for all horses participating in an event at the park.

### **Dogs**

- a. Dogs are allowed on the show grounds.
- b. All dogs must be on a leash (not to exceed 6 ft. in length) and under control of handler at all times, or suitably restrained in a tack stall, etc. Local animal authorities will remove loose dogs at the owner's expense.
- c. Dogs in distress left in cars, trailers, etc., will be removed at the owner's expense.

### **Golf Carts**

- a. The ability to have a golf cart is a privilege, not a right.
- b. Exhibitors wishing to bring their own private golf carts onto Kentucky Horse Park property must purchase a Golf Cart License. This license can be obtained at the Golf Cart Vendor Office for \$25/event or \$50/season.
- c. All drivers must be at least 16 years-of-age with a valid driver's license.
- d. Golf carts are strictly forbidden in all tourist areas of the park.
- e. Golf carts must obey all traffic laws and posted speed limits.
- f. Golf carts can be rented through Dever Show Services at 859-233-9702.
- g. **NO FOUR-WHEELERS, THREE-WHEELERS, OR MOTOR BIKES OVER 50 CC ARE ALLOWED ON PARK GROUNDS.** Golf carts, mopeds, rural rated vehicles such as Gators and Mules, scooters, small motor bikes, and bicycles are allowed.

### **WARNING**

Under Kentucky law, a farm animal activity sponsor, farm animal professional, or other person does not have the duty to eliminate all risk of injury of participation in farm animal activities. There are inherent risks of injury that you voluntarily accept if you participate in farm animal activities.

**Motorized Vehicles:** Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individual in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

**Important notice to all affected parties:** Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facilities where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided, that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings.

**Entries:** Mail completed entries to secretary listed to be RECEIVED by the closing date. All horses entering Kentucky Horse Park grounds must have valid proof of negative coggins test (within 12 months) in the horse's show name and a copy MUST accompany the initial entry as well as copies of all membership/horse registrations pertinent to this event (FEI, US Equestrian Federation and USDF).

### **ATTENTION COMPETITORS**

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with copies of correct association numbers (FEI, USDF, US Equestrian Federation, Equine Canada) for horse, owner, rider and trainer with the submission of entries to the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

**Organizers Rights:** The OC retains the right to split, cancel, or change the day of a class or to further restrict the number of horses a rider may ride in any one class, also to cancel the event under special circumstances with the permission of the US Equestrian Federation and the FEI, and return entry fees. Organizer also retains the right to secure a second FEI panel of judges if entries warrant.

**Awards:** Awards will be distributed to 25% of participants in each competition. Prize money will be mailed within 10 days of the conclusion of the competition. Riders are to appear formally attired and mounted for all award ceremonies.

**Arenas:** Competitions will take place outdoors in 20M X 60M all-weather Ottosport sand footing arenas. Competitions will take place at the World Equestrian Games Stadium. Warm-up will be adjacent in 20M X 60M all-weather Ottosport sand footing arena.

### **Insurances**

**Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities.**

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

**Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy:** Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any Championship or qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies.

**Stabling:** Contact Stable Master: Mary Fike at mfike@feigames2010.org about any stabling questions. 10 x 10 permanent and temporary stalls with doors. No initial bedding provided, but can be purchased on the grounds. Every effort is made to honor stabling requests but are not guaranteed. When asking to be "stabled with" someone, please designate ONE NAME for your group in the "stable with" section of the entry form.

**SMOKING IS FORBIDDEN IN THE BARN AND ADJACENT BARN AREAS.**

**Concessions available upon show grounds during show hours.**

**Starting Order: Competitions not noted below will be drawn according to Art. 425**

**Grand Prix:** Ordinary draw.

**Grand Prix Special:** Draw within groups of five in reverse order of the result of the Grand Prix (group of riders placed 11-15th to start first).

**Grand Prix Freestyle:** Draw within groups of five in reverse order of the result of the Grand Prix (group of riders placed 11-15th to start first).

**Stable Area:** Stewards will regularly monitor the designated FEI stable areas. Riders, owners, grooms and veterinarians will be issued credentials and/or armbands for identification purposes. All horses entered in CDI3\* classes must be stabled in the FEI Stable area and will be stabled together. Due to FEI regulations - no sharps materials in the secure stabling will be allowed.

**Non-U.S. Citizens** and Foreign Competitors must provide proof, in English, of current membership in good standing in their respective National Federation.

**Logos/Advertising:** The General Assembly confirmed the following advertising is permitted on riders: 80 sq.cm on breast pocket of jacket 16 sq.cm on shirt collar. Logos may be worn on the saddle pad.

**Objections:** Protests must be filed in writing and accompanied by a deposit of 150 Swiss Francs.

**Organizer's Rights:** The Organizing Committee retains the right to cancel the event under special circumstances by permission of the USEF and FEI.

## **THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.**
- 2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.**
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.**
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.**
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

All horses exhibited in this show participate entirely at the owner's risk. **Neither the Organizing Committee, show volunteers and staff, the facility or its owners, the Kentucky Horse Park, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the World Equestrian Games Foundation, Inc, any host GMO, USEF or USDF or their members will be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors or spectators. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.**

**Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. # 2010 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships



A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), licensed by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a GMO is received by April 1 of the prior year.

## Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying & Championships:Rider:

- Must be a USDF Participating\* Member at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

## Horse:

- Must be USDF Lifetime Registered (LTR) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be USEF (Annual or Lifetime) recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse/recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.

A horse is not required to have registry papers.

## Owner:

- Must be a USDF member (Participating or Business) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must be a USEF member (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

\*Participating Members are USDF members who join USDF directly

## Minimum Qualifying Scores

One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Grand Prix, in three divisions: Open, Adult Amateur, and Junior/Young Rider. FEI Junior Rider and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only Open divisions. The minimum percentages are as follows:

**USDF Membership Benefits:** USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. **Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:** Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership (BM).)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized shows must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, or FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot and academy classes. For foreign-owned horses competing in a CDI, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport in lieu of a USDF HID or Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) number.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

#### **Memberships Defined**

**Participating Membership (PM):** A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$62), 5-years (\$250), or life (\$1,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$35). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals, and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

**Group Membership (GM):** A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

**Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$175) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

**Non-Member (NM) Identification Number:** For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$20 and a USDF NM form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site.

**Horse Identification (HID) Number:** A one-time tracking number for horses (\$20). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$65. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

**Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR):** A horse with an LHR (\$85) is eligible for Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date received by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary on that same day.


