On-Line Entries:

Accepted on a first come, first serve basis. Visit www.dressageshowinfo.com and look for the opening day of competition. This is a two show weekend. Each show requires a separate entry if entering both shows. One entry per horse/rider combination per show.

Completed entries (all signatures, negative Coggins, copy of correct association numbers and payment) to be mailed to the Show Secretary. **This is a two show weekend.** Each show requires a separate entry if entering both shows. Illinois Coggins/Health Certificate Law: **Equine residing in Illinois:** A current negative Coggins for EIA conducted within a year. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and Entry Permit are not required for Illinois equine. **Equine entering Illinois:** All equine entering Illinois must be accompanied by a current negative Coggins test for EIA conducted within a year, Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of entry. The state of Illinois also requires an Entry Permit number which is issued by the Illinois Department of Agriculture and is good for the life of the CVI, which is 30 days and is free. Late Entries: \$35 fee per show applies to entries postmarked and received after the closing date.

Rider/Horse Change: \$25 fee for either rider or horse change after entries have been submitted.

Time Change Within A Class: \$10 per change if scheduling allows. (Request by 3 PM the day prior)

Faxed Entries: Accepted only if pre-paid with a VISA/MasterCard credit card.

VISA/MasterCard Convenience Fee: \$5 fee applies to any Mail/Fax/Hand Deliver entry paid with a credit card.

Great American/USDF Qualifying Classes: Qualifying classes will not require a separate ride. All exhibitors riding in the Open, Adult Amateur, & Junior/Young Rider classes will pay an additional \$10 USDF fee to have this score entered in the USDF qualifying class at that level. Please add a "Q" next to each class on the entry and add the additional \$10 to the entry form.

Bedding: \$9.50 per bag. May be ordered on the entry form or from show office **by 3PM each day**. No guarantees of same day delivery if ordered after 3PM. If shavings are hauled in by the competitor, there will be a \$25 disposal fee.

Stabling and Tack: Stalls are permanent 10' x 10' with gates in show barn. All horses must have a stall. Bedding will be sold at the show. Competitors are responsible for stall damage.

SMOKING IS PROHIBITED IN STALL AREAS. Stabling requests honored when possible.

Entry Cancellation/Refunds: Office fee is not refundable. Entries with written cancellation on or before the closing date will receive 100% refund of all fees minus the office fee. NO REFUNDS after Closing Date even if Closing Date is extended.

No Show Competitors: All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and the time slots may be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.

"Dressage Dollar" Sponsored Classes for the June 19 - 20 Show: Any class sponsored for Friday or Saturday, will have dressage dollars awarded to First, Second & Third place to be spent anywhere on the show grounds except at the Food Pavilion or with the Photographer.

To sponsor a class, please send a check for \$50.00 to IDCTA, c/o Molly Fine, 36887 Old Woods Trail, Gurnee, IL 60031. Dressage Dollar Sponsors will be announced during the class and a 1/4 page ad may be placed in the program. PDF or JPG format preferred.

Awards: Riders must clearly specify division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as Open. Riders may enter only one division per class. Awards will be broken out by division such that Open is separate from AA/JR/YR. If there are four or more AA riders and/or four or more JR/YR riders in a class, the class will be separated and pinned by division. If there are less than four AA and JR/YR riders combined, the class will be pinned

as one class.

Dressage Dollars are awarded thru Third place when the class has four or more riders for the Friday and Saturday classes. Prizes are awarded thru Third place when the class has four or more riders for Sunday classes. Ribbons awarded for both shows to sixth place for all classes.

The USDF/Dover Adult Amateur Medal will be awarded to the Second Level Test 3, class #212 for Friday and Second Level Test 3, class #312 for Sunday. Must receive a score of 60% or higher.

High Point Ribbon and Prize For Friday/Saturday Show Only: Will be given to the horse & rider combination with the highest % in the following divisions: 1)AA Training; 2)AA First; 3)AA Second; 4)AA Third; 5)AA Fourth; 6)AA FEI; 7)JR/YR Training; 8)JR/YR First; 9)JR/YR Second; 10)JR/YR Third; 11)JR/YR Fourth; 12)JR/YR FEI; 13) Open Training; 14)Open First; 15)Open Second; 16)Open Third; 17)Open Fourth; and 18)Open FEI. High point award will also be given to the horse and rider combination with the highest % in all vintage classes (one prize for all vingage classes). Vintage Classes – Vintage is defined as rider age of 50 years and above. Vintage classes are designated with a V. They cannot be used as USDF Qualifying classes. **Thoroughbred high point** award for TB Horse/Rider combination with Highest % at Training Level, First Level, Second Level, Third Level, Fourth Level, FEI combined.

Entry confirmation will be e-mailed to rider. **E-mail addresses are required and must be clearly printed.** It is the responsibility of the rider to inform show management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after reviewing the schedule.

Arenas: Outdoor arenas have all-weather sand footing. Warm-up rings are same footing. All tests in standard arena. Lounging area of same footing. In case of overflow, show may elect to run some classes in short arena. Posted schooling schedule will be available at the office. Some classes may also be held in the indoor sand arena.

Judged on presentation, neatness & appearance of handler, overall condition, handling techniques, appropriate tack/equipment, demonstration of correct training & ability to show horse to best of its ability.

HANDLERS AND ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DSHB CLASSES:

Handler: Any person who holds, walks or trots a horse while it is being judged in the in the competition area or ring for any In-Hand, Group or Championship class, except as noted below.

Assistant Handler: Any person, other than Handler, who holds or walks a horse in competition arena during a class, whether or not horse is being judged at the time. An Asst. Handler is permitted only for call-backs after In-Hand or Group classes, for Championships and for handling non-competing mares/foals which accompany another entry in the competition arena. Asst Handlers may not show a horse at the trot, (*ex. for horses not being judged but accompanying a mare or foal being judged*). If not USEF members, are exempted from the USEF Show Pass fee. **All Handlers and Asst Handlers MUST sign original entry form or Handler/Assistant Handler Release (on website) prior to entering ring and MUST have wristbands.**


Judged under saddle as a group at walk, trot and canter according to criteria listed on the “USDF Materiale Class” score sheet. Horses must be at least 36 months of age to participate.

Breeding Show Class Procedures

The triangle measures approximately 30 meters on the long side and 22 meters on each of the short sides. When called by the Ringmaster, present your horse to the Judge at "A" for conformation judging. Upon direction, follow the procedure as diagrammed below:

** Higher scoring horses may be asked to return to the ring for reevaluation at the end of a class.*

** Foals may NOT be shown loose.*



- Stand Horse at "A" for conformation judging.
- Walk small triangle: A-B-C-A
- Trot large triangle: A-D-E-A
- Leave judging area promptly unless requested to do otherwise by the judge.

- B41. DUTCH WARMBLOOD (KWPN or NAWPN) - Send breed registration papers for eligibility.

Judged under saddle as a group at walk, trot and canter according to criteria listed on the “USDF Materiale Class” score sheet. Horses must be at least 36 months of age to participate.


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- Walk small triangle: A-B-C-A

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF BM.) Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux, quadrille, FEI Para-Equestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$75), 5-years (\$300), or life (\$1,500). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$60). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$200) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (EM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$25 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$25). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$70. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$95) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.



2015 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2015 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must have a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LTR) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Membership recorded at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse/recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s) of record.
- A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF membership (PM* or Business Member (BM)) at the time the qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.
- Must have a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, or Life) at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores. One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for levels through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.
